Bailey's Range: A burger 'shack' and ice cream parlor, Bailey's won "best decor" in a recent poll. The burgers are made from 100% grass fed Missouri range beef and the ice cream from scratch, with no preservatives. It was also ranked as the city's best ice cream parlor in a recent poll. For the ultimate in St. Louis comfort food, this is the place.
